January 2nd Topic: Third-Party Safety Consultants May Be



Government Affairs

The following information was recently sent out from Society

Greetings All:

This is a summary/update addressing some of Society's governmental affairs issues since August. We hope this information is of value and look forward to hearing any feedback or comments you may have:

National Issues

#1: OSHA and EPA MOU on TSCA

The Society is continuing to monitor the issue of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between OSHA and EPA on the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) to address chemicals that the EPA reviews under the act. TSCA permits the EPA to require additional worker protections such as Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for a chemical. In the past EPA considered OSHA's Permissible Exposure Limit's (PEL) as outdated. The MOU continues EPA's efforts to collaborate with OSHA concerning worker safety, but also meets the mandates of the 2016 updates to TSCA (Lautenberg Chemical Safety for the 21st Century Act). Late last year an industry group, the TSCA New Chemicals Coalition (NCC), suggested the EPA forge a process with OSHA to consult about worker exposure.

#2. Raise Awareness of Fall Protection Management Programs

September 18, 2018: ASSP called on OSHA to elevate the importance of fall protection management programs and advise employers to look to consensus standards such as ANSI/ASSP Z359 and ANSI/ASSP A10 for the latest industry practices.

#3. OSHA Extends Some Compliance Dates for Beryllium Standard

August 9, 2018: OSHA extended the compliance date for specific ancillary requirements of the general industry beryllium standard to Dec. 12, 2018. The extension maintains essential safety and health protections for workers, the agency states, while giving it time to work on a proposal that would clarify certain provisions of the standard and address employers' compliance burdens.


