### **Mechanical Integrity**

What is Mechanical Integrity (MI)? How do organizations establish maintenance programs and why should (even small) businesses consider them? How can failures lead to incidents including EHS, quality, and productivity? Brian will share his opinion on common failures he sees across EHS/MI in the various industries that he serves, and offer a top 3 mistakes made and possible solutions. He will share how an EHS pro might "sell" better mechanical integrity and preventative maintenance programs to upper levels of management. What are the costs vs. benefits of even the most basic PM program? What are some of the larger cost spills he's seen as a result of failed integrity testing, or integrity testing pitfalls might be good for a lot of smaller companies. Is a clamp a good way to fix a pipe permanently? Why/why not? He will help us understanding the basics of "good" mechanical integrity. Many of us are good at finding root "human" causes, but what are indicators of "preventable" mechanical failures?
