On October 4, 1998, Bakersfield was officially chartered as the 20th chapter in Region I.

Passport Training Updates

Effective November 1, 2021, there are important changes to Passport orientation training. Passport Safety Training is required by most person(s) working on most oilfield leases in the Central Valley.

Passport training covers a wide range of health and safety topics – personal protective equipment, field hazards, hydrogen sulfide, fall protection, overhead powerlines, confined space awareness, code of safe work practices, and more.

Check in with your company's designated safety manager or supervisor for upcoming training opportunities through regional training facilities.

Did you know? OSHA is initiating the <u>rulemaking process</u> to consider a heat-specific standard to prevent heat injury and illness in outdoor and indoor work settings. OSHA is <u>seeking</u> <u>public comments</u> on topics such as heat stress thresholds, acclimatization planning, exposure monitoring, and the nature, types, and effectiveness of controls. Comments must be submitted by December 27, 2021.
