Cal/OSHA Increases Civil Penalty Amounts for 2024

The increases adjust for inflation and ensure Cal/OSHA is consistent with California and federal law. For citations issued on or after January 1, 2024.

- The maximum penalty for General and Regulatory violations, including Posting and Recordkeeping violations is \$15,873.
- The maximum penalty for Willful and Repeat violations is \$158,727.
- The minimum penalty for Willful violations is \$11,337.

Cannabis Industry

Cal/OSHA 30-Hour General Industry Training Requirement

In accordance with the California Business and Professions Code, <u>section 26051.5</u>, all employers in the cannabis industry with two or more employees, including those who cultivate, manufacture, distribute, sell, and test marijuana products, must ensure one supervisor and one employee have successfully completed a Cal/OSHA 30-hour general industry outreach training course.
