
Build Your Leadership Skills →

Officer Santiago Hernandez – California Highway Patrol, Commercial Industry Education Program

Free California Highway Patrol Resources and Insights on Distracted Driving (Part 2)

This meeting will feature Officer Santiago Hernandez with the California Highway Patrol. Mr. Hernandez will be presenting Insights on Distracted Driving & CHP Resources. In the presentation, Mr. Hernandez will explore distracted driving, CHP resources available to organizations, practical traffic insights including pavement markings for fog, how those pressurized traffic loops work at intersections, and Q&A.

Dr. Jeff Freesemann MD, Medical Director at ABC Occupational Medical Center

Workplace Eye Injuries – Common and not so Common

This session will review common workplace eye injuries. Dr. Freesemann will also explain a few non-work-related eye issues, latest treatment options including cataracts, corneal transplants, and Lasik eye surgery.

Jeffery M. Freesemann, M.D., is the Medical Director and owner of ABC Occupational Medical Center (ABC) in Bakersfield and Delano. He has over 14 years of Occupational Medicine experience. His primary duty at ABC is to provide administrative support, and medical guidance, to the medical providers at ABC. Additionally, Dr. Freesemann provides medical treatment, and claims management, for patients that have suffered a work-related injury/illness. Freesemann is also a Medical Review Officer (MRO) and performs DOT exams as a member of the National Registry of Certified Medical Examiners (NRCME). Additionally, he performs medical-legal disability evaluations as a Qualified Medical Evaluator (QME). Dr. Freesemann earned his medical degree at Georgetown University of Medicine and Internal Medicine internship at Oregon Health Sciences University. He is board certified in Internal Medicine.



OSHA – Did You Know?

OSHA has Letters of Interpretation to explain how to comply with OSHA regulations in specific workplace situations. Their subject matter experts write responses to questions from employers, employees, or other parties who want clarification about OSHA standards. Responses are posted to OSHA's website so that others in the industry can stay in compliance and keep workers safe. Recent letters of interpretation issued by OSHA addressed topics such as preventing trips and falls on steps, exposure to hazardous chemicals, and forklift injuries. These letters are part of OSHA's longstanding commitment to expand their compliance assistance outreach to America's employers and workers.
