## ***Regulatory & Employment Law Update***

California Employment Law Update – With a new year comes new legal requirements for California employers. In 2025, several laws have been put into effect that impact California employers including new mandatory notice requirements for employees, changes to paid family leave, and efforts by the State to give jurisdiction to the Public Employment Relations Board over private sector employers. Minimum wage changes will go into effect on January 1, which will have a ripple effect on other compensation obligations. On the federal level, the One Big Beautiful Bill included changes that effect employers across the country.

## ***Comprehensive Overview of Burn Injuries & Care***

This presentation will provide a comprehensive overview of burn injuries, including the classification of first, second, and third-degree burns. It will outline essential first aid procedures for minor burns and offer guidance on when to consult a burn specialist. After this presentation, participants will be better equipped to – classify and assess different types of burns, recognize the factors that influence the severity of burn injuries, implement initial burn care principles, and understand the burn recovery process.

Burn injuries can be traumatic and painful, significantly impacting an individual's life. The skin plays a vital role in our identity and function, and prompt, effective treatment is critical at the time of injury to prevent or minimize unnecessary scarring. Scarring not only alters appearance but can also restrict skin functionality and range of motion. Given the specialized nature of burn care, it is essential that these injuries are managed by a qualified burn specialist.
